

National trends in use of monitored anesthesia care for outpatient gastrointestinal endoscopy in the Veterans Health Administration



"In recent years, use of monitored anesthesia care (MAC) for GI endoscopy has been increasing...It is estimated that use of MAC...resulted in additional national expenditures of more than \$1 billion for Medicare and commercially insured patients in 2009 and is associated with higher rates of 30-day endoscopy-related complications compared with standard sedation."

"Total PCMH staffing was associated with higher levels of psychotherapy receipt, and higher proportions of PCMH social worker staffing were associated with better performance on measures of antidepressant treatment adequacy in VA integrated care programs."
